The Bureau, one of ten Commonwealth Agricultural Bureaux, was established at Rothamsted in 1929. Administratively and financially the Bureau is distinct from the Station, but the two work closely together. The Director of the Station is Consultant Director of the Soil Bureau.

The function of the Bureau is to assist workers in soil science, primarily throughout the Commonwealth but also throughout the world. A monthly abstract journal *Soils and Fertilizers*, covering the world literature of soil science, the use of fertilisers and the soil relationships and nutrition of all crops is published; also occasional monographs—Technical Communications—on subjects of general interest and a series of *Annotated Bibliographies* on specific subjects.

The work of the Commonwealth Agricultural Bureaux is recorded in its own report published annually by the Stationery Office.
